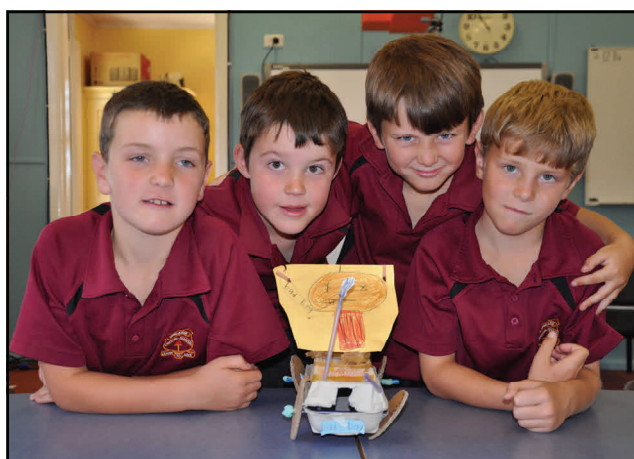




INTENSIVE SWIMMING

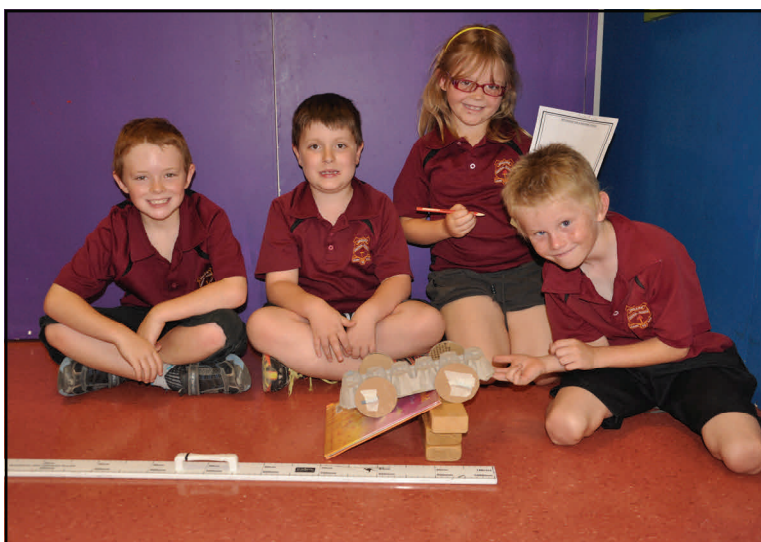
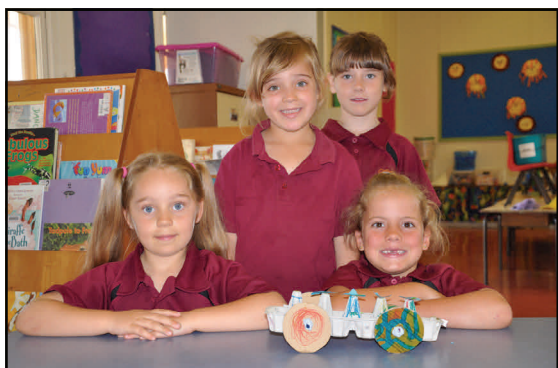
Primary students have been working hard on their swimming skills this week, and having lots of fun too, as these photos show!
