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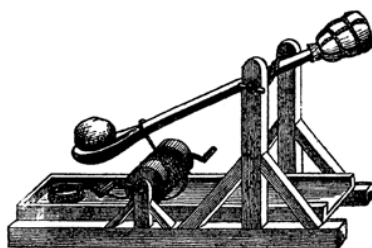
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## News this week...

## CENTRALSCHOOLS 14s BOYS SUPER 8s CRICKET with Mrs Roscarel

On Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> October Tom Roscarel, Daniel Potter, Ryan Crofts, Kai Davies, Josh Roscarel, Dean Otovic, Jackson Benness (above) and Mrs Roscarel travelled to Bolton Park in Wagga on the school bus, ably driven by Jason Lewis.

The game is virtually a shortened version of the T20 Big Bash. There are shortened boundaries and there is a zone behind the bowler in which all runs that are scored get doubled. Each batting pair bat for two overs and if they get out the **bowling** team get five runs and the batters swap ends. Each person bowls for one over and then the fielding team rotates positions. The idea is to encourage the batters to go for a Big Bash and to score lots of runs, while at the same time giving everyone a go. Unfortunately quite a few teams pulled out on the day. However we still played three games for the day and had three very convincing wins. Kai and Josh had a superb

first partnership smashing 70 runs off the first two overs of the day, with some cracking 6's- which became 12's- hit back over the bowler by Kai.
