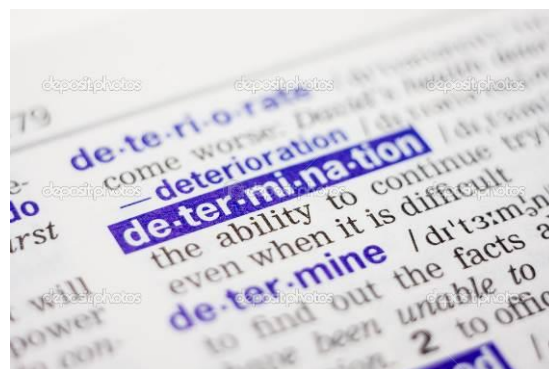

Dear Parents/Guardians and Community of Ungarie Central School

'Legumes' is the name given to any one of the thousands of varieties of beans or peas. You might have heard legumes referred to as pulses, and that's because pulses are the edible seeds of members of the legume family. Some of the edible legumes that you may be familiar with are soy, cannellini, butter and red kidney beans. Chick peas and lentils.

Legumes are given the title of 'nutrition powerhouse'. They are packed full of protein, and while they do contain carbohydrate for energy they are low GI so don't cause a spike in blood sugar. They make you feel satisfied and pleasantly full and have a good proportion of fibre, which is good for your digestive health.

Beef and Bean Burritos

Serves 6

Ingredients:

- ½ tablespoon olive oil
- 1 large brown onion, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 400g lean beef mince
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- ¼ teaspoon chili powder
- 400g can diced tomatoes
- 1 red capsicum, washed and chopped
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- ½ cup water
- 400g can red kidney beans, drained
- 400g can cannellini beans, drained
- ½ cup coriander leaves, washed and chopped
- 12 flour tortillas
- 1 cup grated low fat cheddar cheese
- 1 cup natural yoghurt
- Lettuce leaves



Method:

1. Heat oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add onion and garlic. Cook, stirring occasionally until onion is tender.
2. Add mince. Cook, stirring, for 3-5 minutes or until browned.
3. Add cumin, paprika and chilli powder. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute
4. Add tomatoes, capsicum, tomato paste, water, red kidney beans and cannellini beans. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer, uncovered, for 20 minutes or until sauce is thickened. Then stir in coriander and remove from the heat.
5. Warm tortillas following directions on packet. Spoon beef mixture along centre of tortillas, and roll up to enclose filling. Place in a large, greased baking dish. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake for 10 minutes or until cheese melts and burritos start to brown.
6. Serve with yoghurt and salad leaves
