

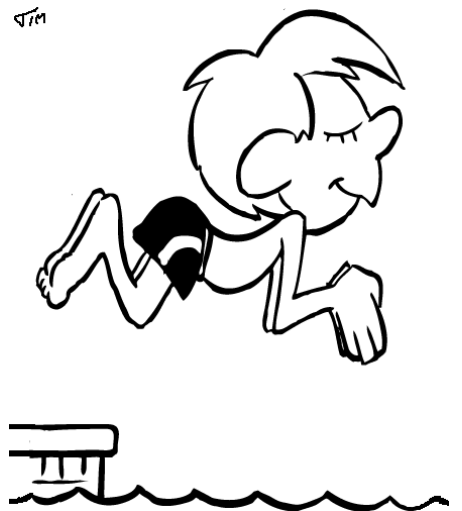

Life Saved by a stranger... Last month I received an email from a young waiter called JC who served me in the first class lounge of Sydney airport. After I said a simple thank you for him clearing my plate, he noticed my 100 Things shirt and went to the website. He then wrote to me and told me that at a time of unknown and a few lows in his life, my simple 'thanks' had inspired him to create a list. The next day he and a friend went for a bush walk and on top of a cliff wrote down their lists on which both read 'Save a Life'. As they penned down this item and discussed it, they heard an immediate scream near by and when they ran to investigate discovered a 16 yr old boy who had slipped off a cliff and fallen 40 metres. They then ran to his aid and saw huge head injuries before calling the police who quickly air lifted the young boy to a hospital. They were told later by the paramedics that without their actions, the young boy would have died! I tell you this story because as I arrived in Sydney airport today, JC ran up and shook my head. He reckons his life has changed and he can't stop smiling. If there's ever an example of how important it is to consider what you want to do in life, please let yourself be inspired by this absolute legend! 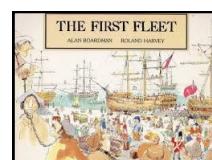

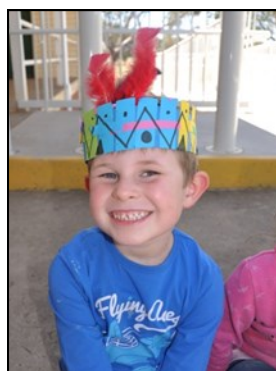
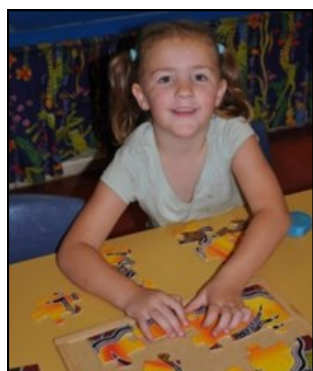
