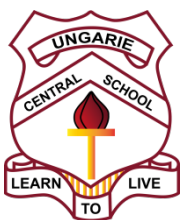

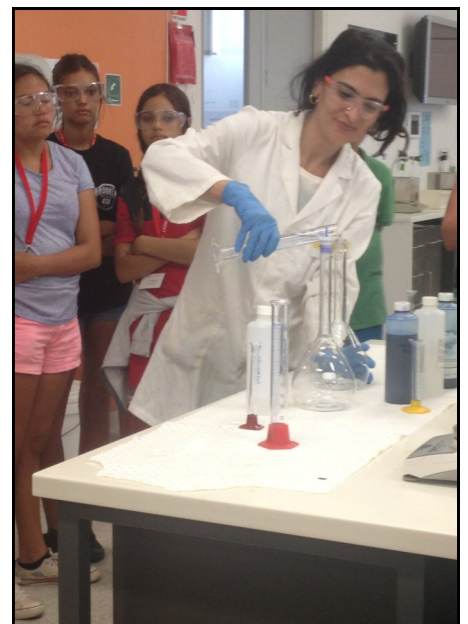
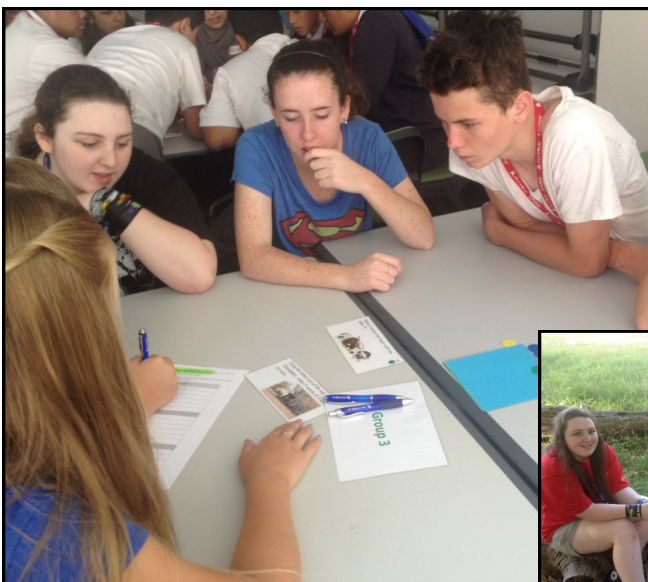
YEAR 8 BEYOND THE GATE ASPIRE with Miss Imrie

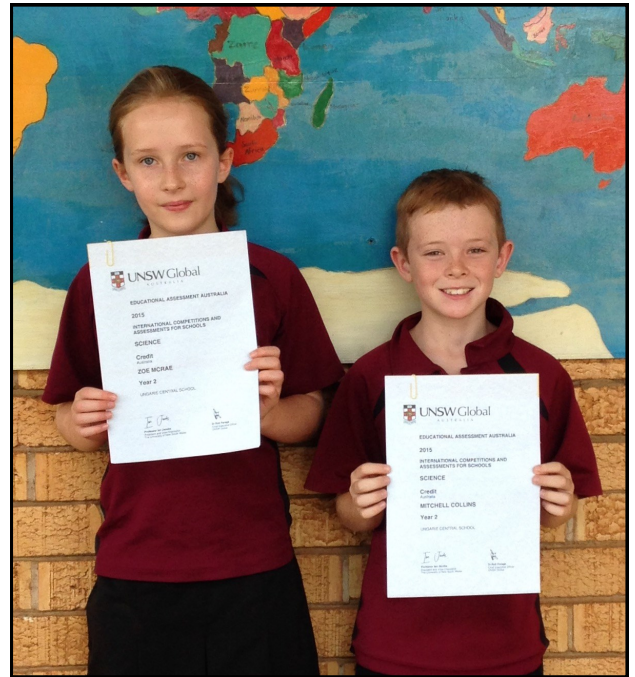

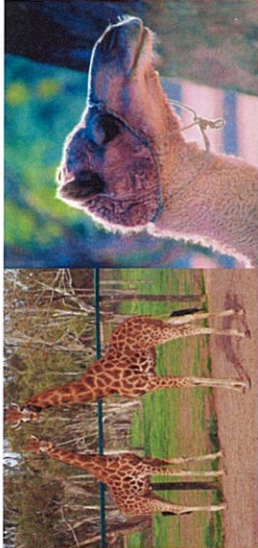
