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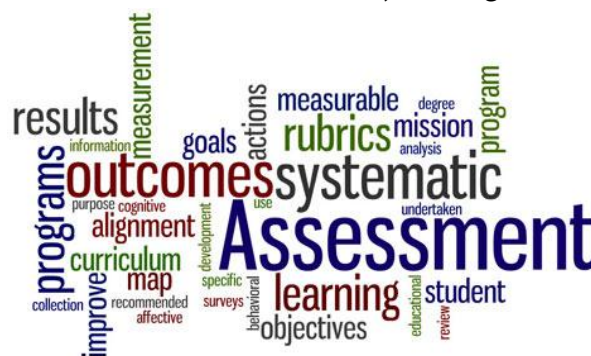
News this week...

Accountability

Secondary How2Learn Session – Accountability

On Tuesday, Mr Dodhy and Mrs Jackson lead a session with Yrs 7-10 students, based on accountability and how it applies to their learning and as a personality trait in general. The session began with students being offered lollies – as many as they wanted from the bag, which unfortunately meant that there wasn't enough to go around the whole group. We spoke about how making judgements or decisions can impact on those around us, including seeing how many people were in the group and how many lollies were in the bag, and deciding how many lollies to take! After looking at a quick power point presentation, students then put themselves into groups of 5 and were given a 5 step challenge to complete together – making a self-propelled tugboat. There were a few clues as to how to most effectively organise themselves for completing the challenge, but the competitive edge got the best of most people, making the group activity a bit of a challenge in itself! After testing the tugboats in the yabby pond, we concluded the session, wrapping up with a quick debrief on how accountable each team member was for the success of their boats and the importance of owning your decisions and behaviours when learning.
