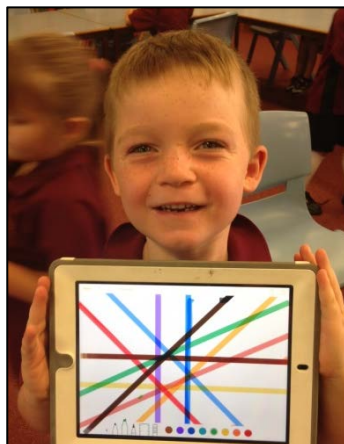

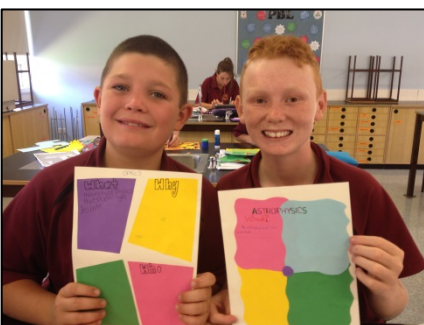

## YR 9/10 DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

This year the Year 9/10 Design and Technology students will be undertaking DESIGN Projects with a diverse 'Project-Based-Learning' approach to their class. The group is one of four schools participating in this style of education.

The unit of study for these students at Ungarie Central School during Term 1 is: - 'SIGN LANGUAGE'.

They have been asked to consider the situation of Rural Properties being more difficult to locate than normal addresses.

They will be asked to answer a number of leading questions about the situation to trigger their thinking and to engage them in a range of communication techniques that will connect them and their projects with the wider school community.

Each student will be working with a client who requires a 'Farm Sign' to help individualise their property. They will design and make the sign with careful negotiation and contact with the businesses in the surrounding district to help undergo the construction. They will be presenting their final designs to the public during Term II this year.

Last week the students visited a locally owned 'Steel Fabrication Business'. This business is owned by an ex student from UCS, Mr Simon Hale, who kindly answered a number of questions that the students had about the production of signs suitable for farm properties.

They also visited the front gate of a local family at Ungarie, (Mr and Mrs Bryant) to see first-hand what a difference a well designed 'Farm Sign' could make to the entrance of a property.

This week the students visited Ag-n-Vet Services in Ungarie and spoke to Mr Garry Johnson who kindly gave them information and quotes for suitable products and specifications in preparation for the first meeting with their clients this Wednesday. During these meetings the students will be discussing the design features and information required to commence their individual property signs.

On completion of each of the final design ideas, the students will again be working with staff from Agn-Vet Services, and Mr Hale, to order the required materials for each project then cut materials to the required specifications, ready to commence assembly.

The most important part of this project is the work readiness skills that each student will experience and the presentation of their final signs and respective design portfolios.

Updated information will follow as the students progress towards their project presentation event.

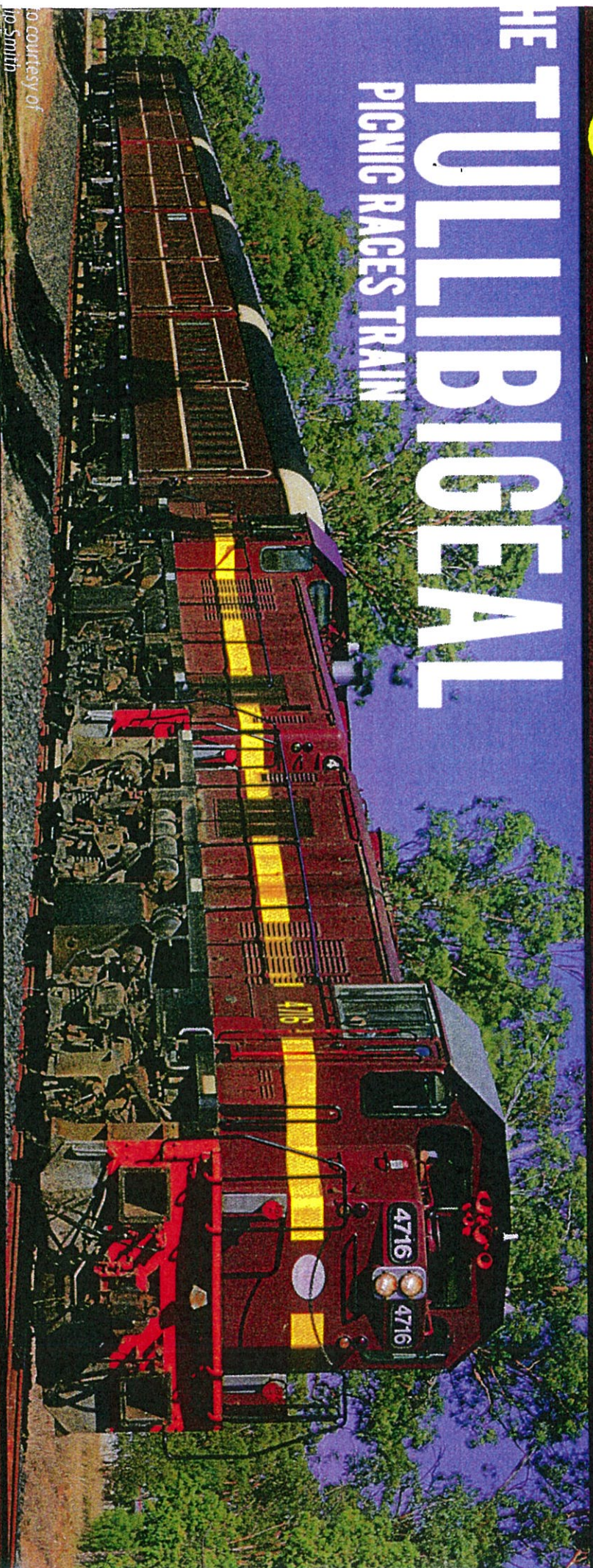
