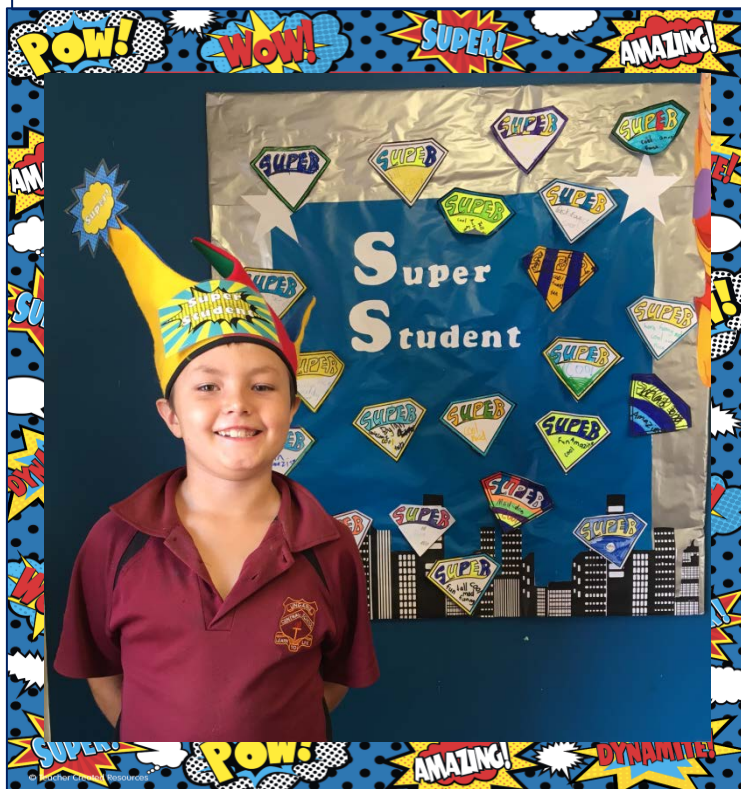

RED CROSS NUTRITIONAL VISITS

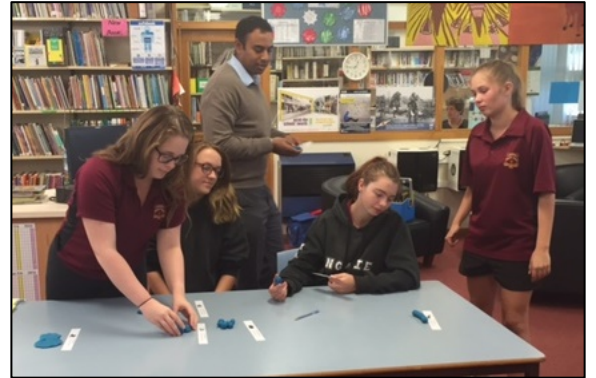
