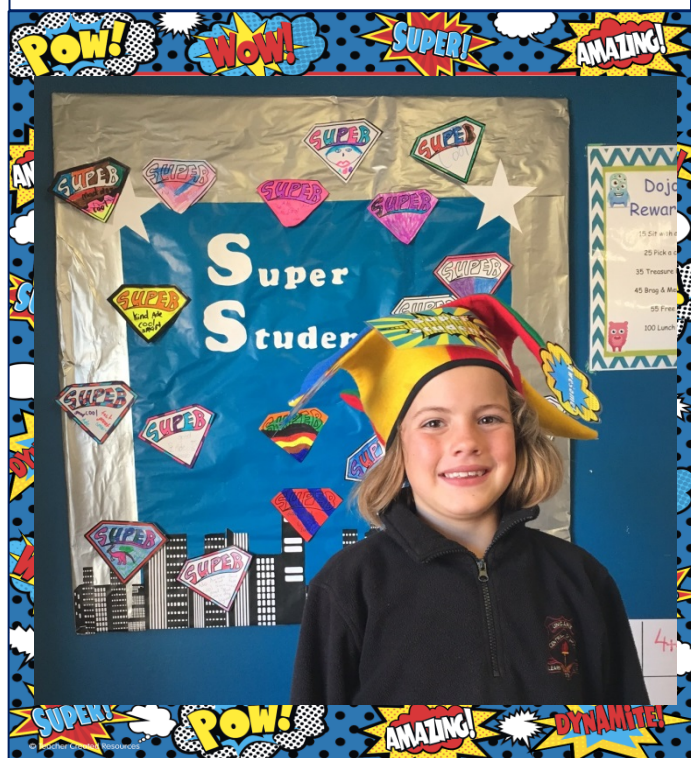

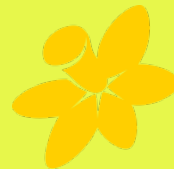

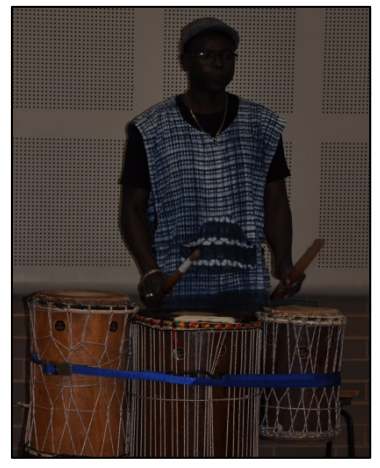


Congratulations to the Primary girls netball team on making the grand final of the Western Region PSSA Netball Knockout. This will be played in Dubbo today.

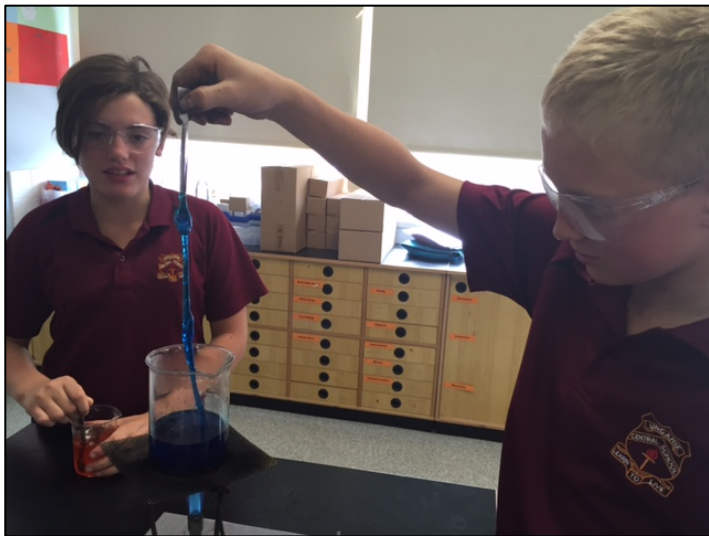
