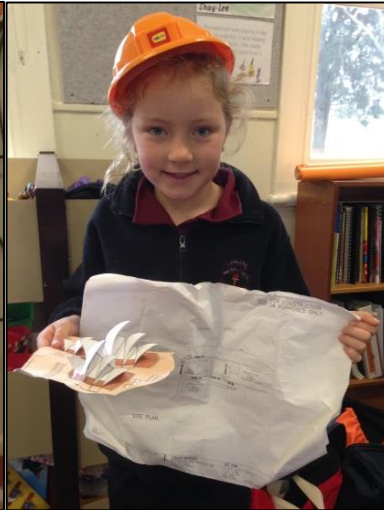
Best wishes to Vanessa Robb for a quick recovery with her hamstring injury. She was just about to cross the finish line when it tore. David Clarke added support at the hospital.

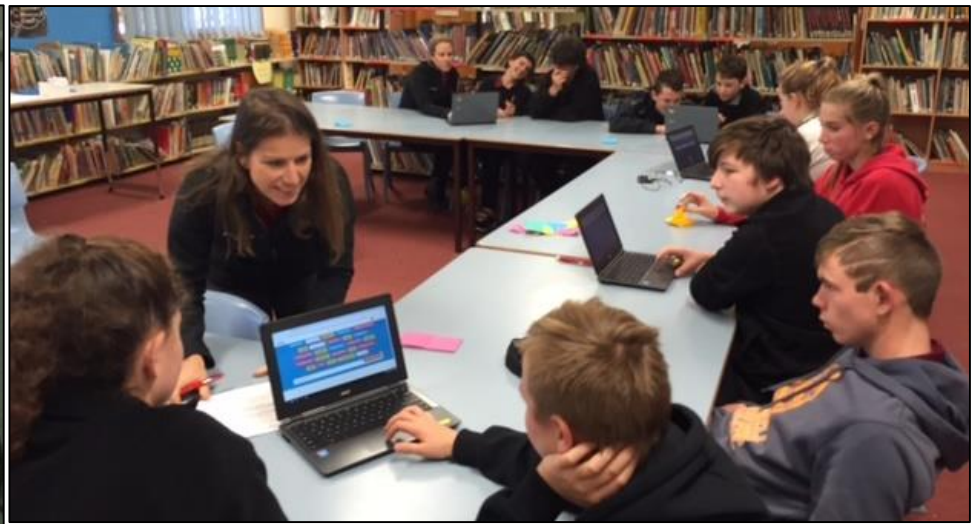
