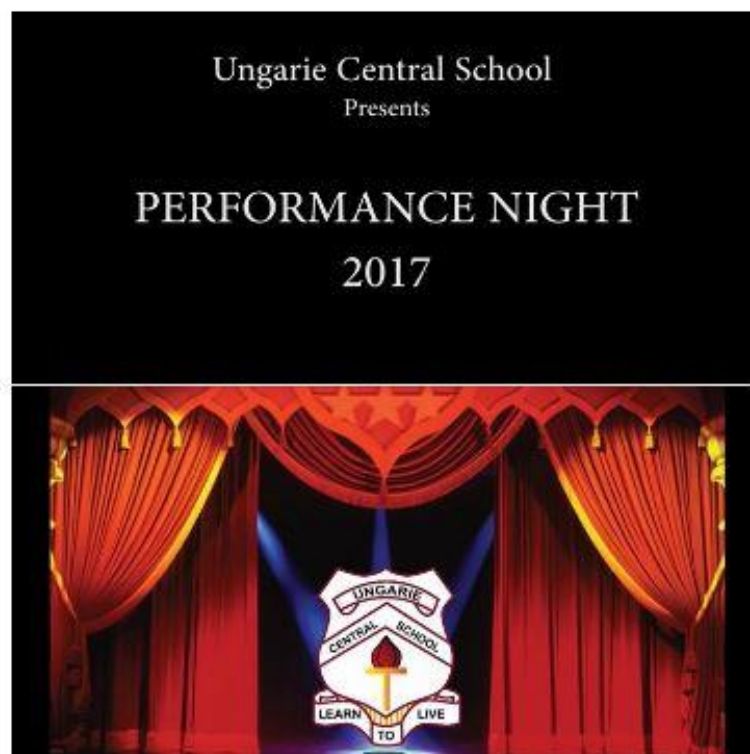

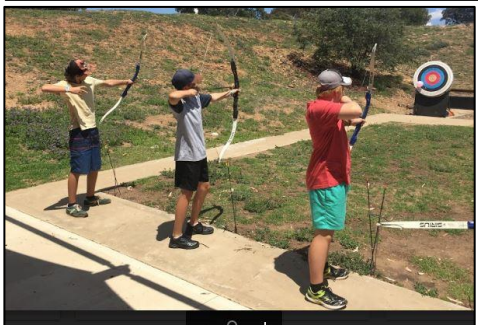




## YEAR 10 LACHLAN ACCESS PROGRAM CROSSROADS CAMP
