## CONCERT

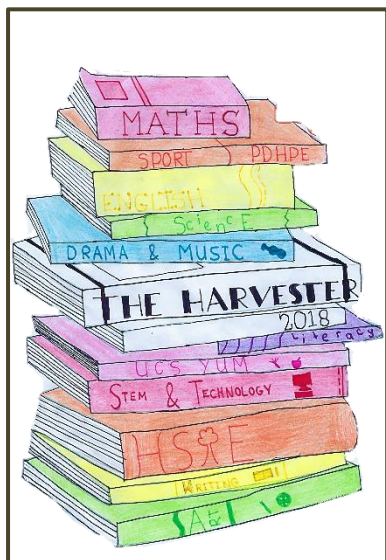

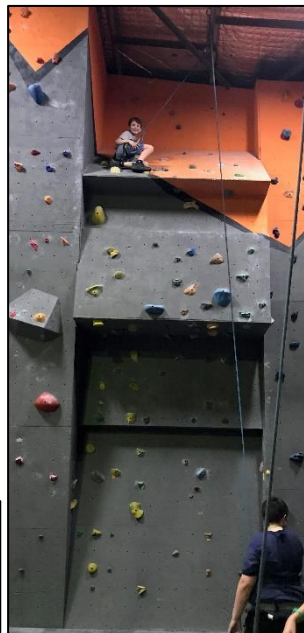

## NORTHERN NSW SCHOOL DTL SHOOT

The squad Abby shot in throughout the day. The other students were from Woodenbong Central.



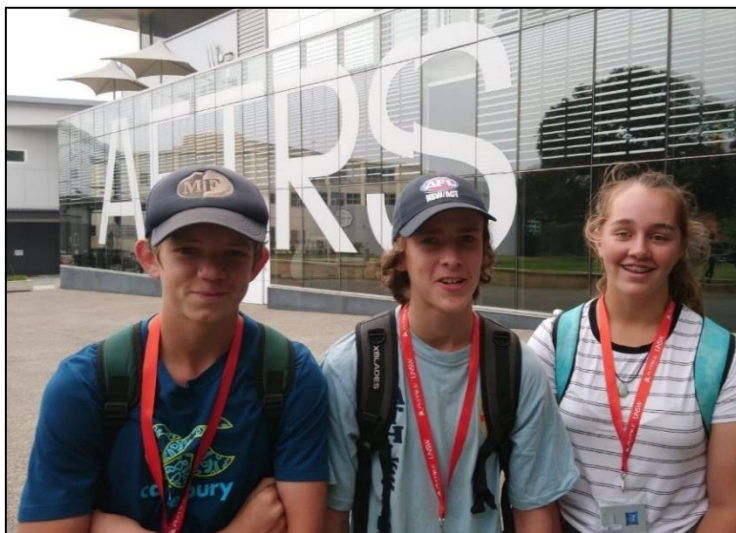
Abby Wason travelled to Tamworth to compete at the Northern NSW School DTL (Down The Line) Shooting Competition. On Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> November the students had a practice session and the competition was held on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> November. The majority of the students were from schools in the northern part of the state but any students are allowed to compete as it is the only DTL School Competition currently held in NSW. AA, A, B and C Grade shooters competed in 4 events: Single Barrel, Double Barrel, Double Rise and Point Score. In Single Barrel (25 targets) the shooter can only fire one shell in their attempt to hit each clay, in Double Barrel (25 targets) they can fire two shells if needed at each clay, in Double Rise (10 pair) two clays are thrown at a time and the shooter fires once at each clay, and in Point Score (25 targets) one clay is thrown and the shooter scores 3 points if it is hit with the first shell and 2 point if it is hit with the second shell. Abby thoroughly enjoyed meeting the other students and competing against them. She was very excited with her success in winning the B Grade 'Double Barrel' and 'Double Rise' events and coming second in the B Grade Single Barrel. Congratulations Abby.



## YEAR 8 'BEYOND THE GATE' ASPIRE UNSW EXCURSION

Year 8 students, Abby Wason, Jye Hoskinson and Jack Crofts were lucky enough to be given an opportunity to spend three days in Sydney through the University of NSW's ASPIRE program.

This year's excursion had a focus on film. The students went to the Australian Film, Television and Radio School and learned about different film techniques.
