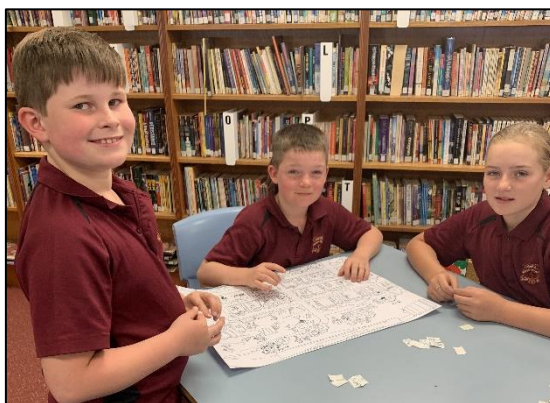


SCHOOL HAPPENINGS
