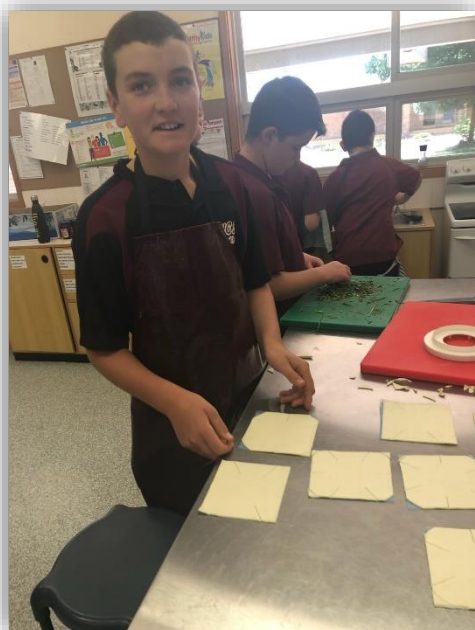

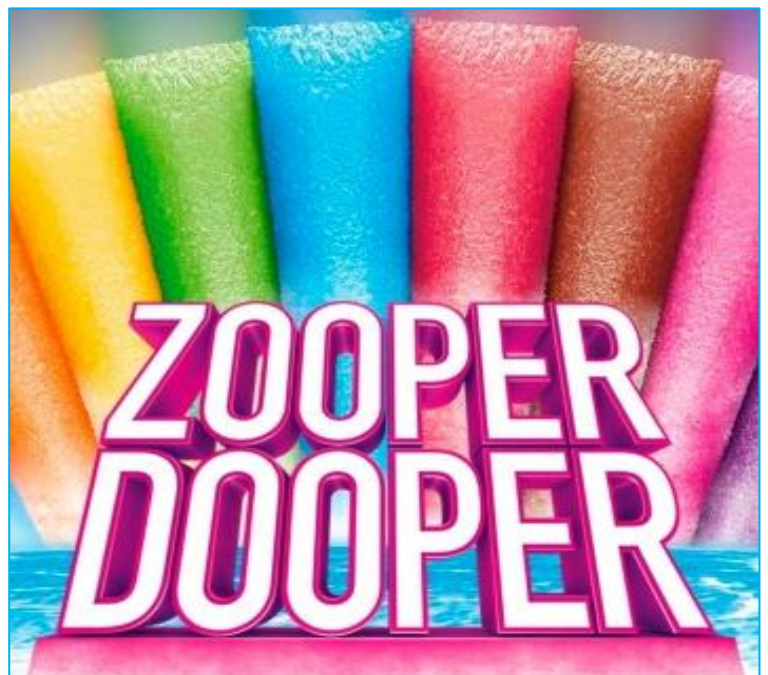

On Wednesday 30th October, the team from UNSW ASPIRE visited the school. They conducted workshops with the students on the following areas:

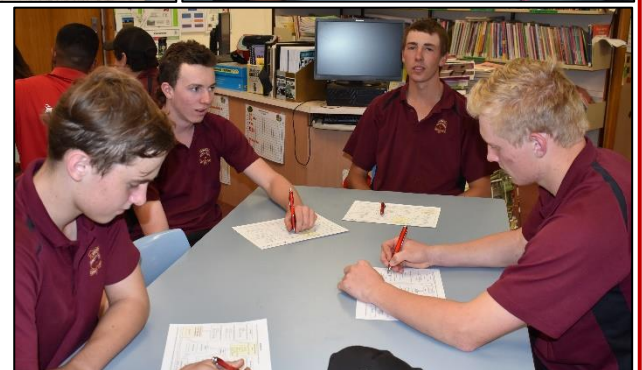
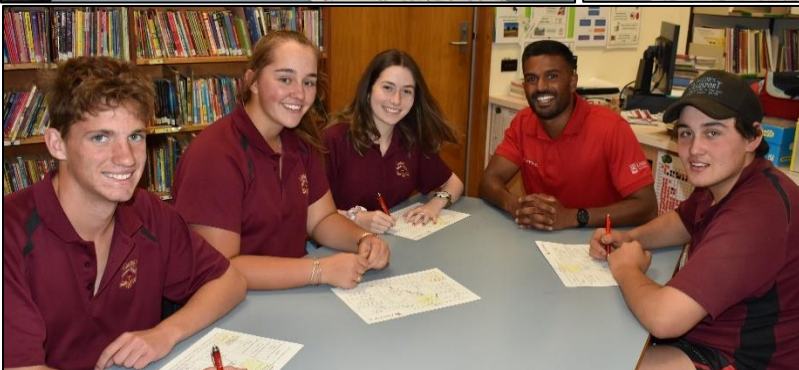

YEAR 7 UNSW ASPIRE 'JUMP INTO UNI' EXCURSION

On Tuesday 23rd and Wednesday 24th October, Jayda, Allister, Harry and Mrs Roscarel attended an ASPIRE event in Dubbo. They were picked up by the Tulli bus Tuesday afternoon and arrived in Dubbo Big 4 Caravan Park around 5.30pm.

When they arrived they found their rooms and met the people they would be sharing with. It was then time for tea, with standard favourites of chicken schnitz and spaghetti bolognese on offer. As soon as we finished we loaded onto buses and were taken to the Bowling Alley. We played two games of bowls before we had to head back. There were mixed results, with a few gutter balls in play, a couple of strikes, and Harry using his spin bowling technique to smash numerous pins down. Jayda bowled with some girls from Goodooga that she had met in her room. Back on the buses and back for showers and bed.

After breakfast in the morning, bags were packed and loaded onto the bus before heading to the Dubbo Cultural Centre where the day was spent. The first activity that they attended was a medical session where they learnt where the major organs were in the body. They were taught how to tend to a snake bite and then practiced bandaging someone who had been bitten. Students learnt how to use a stethoscope, find a heart beat and use a pressure cuff to find blood pressure.

The next session was law and all of the attending students in their group took part in a mock trial, our students were all part of the jury. After acting out the script they had to deliberate and found the defendant NOT GUILTY.

Lunch was next - great food, the only thing was we were too full to eat many of the scrumptious cakes they had for dessert. The last session was a science session where they did experiments to learn about surface tension, made a lava lamp and experimented with light refraction.

In all of the sessions they were made aware of many of the types of jobs that could use some of the skills that they had learnt. To end the day, a group photo was taken. It was then onto the bus, a short stop at Maccas and then a much quieter bus trip home than the one on the way to Dubbo.

An exhausted group arrived back at school at around 6.00pm. Harry, Jayda and Allister were great ambassadors for our school and were a pleasure to take away. The ASPIRE excursion made our students aware of a variety of professions that are available to study, and hopefully will start them thinking about a possible career path once they finish school.
