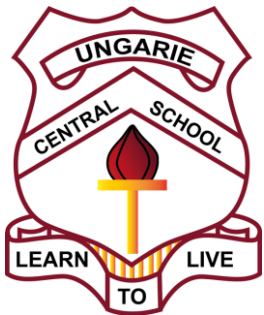

UNSW YEAR 10 ASPIRE CONNECT EXCURSION

Year 10 students, Kadee Gerhard-Scali, Michelene Izzard, Madi Cassidy and William Batty travelled to Sydney on Monday 20th May with Mrs Cooper to take part in the University of New South Wales Aspire Connect program until Friday 24th May. The first two days of the program had students involved in learning about the 5 major 'Global Challenges' that students at the university are working towards solving. These are Rapid Urbanisation, Climate Change, Refugees and Immigration, Inequality and 21st Century Technology. Students were given the opportunity to undertake lectures by Phd students and expert lecturers in one particular field. This allowed them to see first hand what university is like, as well as learn about an important issue in our society.

Students then had to prepare a 3 minute presentation demonstrating what they had learned about their topic. The best presentations from each challenge area then presented their performance to the whole group of approximately 150 people. There were many interesting and imaginative performances.

The second part of the excursion saw the students visiting different businesses and speaking to business people to learn more about how they reached their position and the journey they undertook to get there. Kadee, Madi and Michi visited places associated with careers in Health and Sport. They visited the Prince of Wales Hospital where they saw many different aspects of hospital life and were given the opportunity to undertake some training in CPR and intubation. They also visited the hyperbaric unit and learned about the important role this unit plays in healing many different types of injuries. They then went to talk to people in different aspects of the sporting industry and visited Rugby Australia, Cricket Australia and Sydney Rooster headquarters.

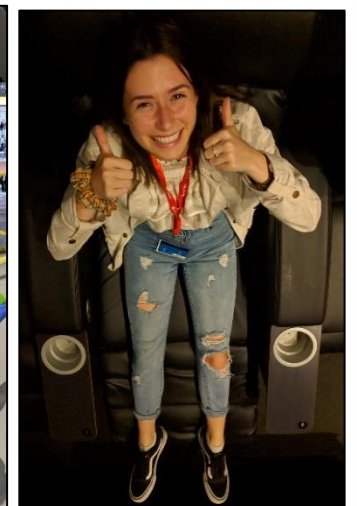
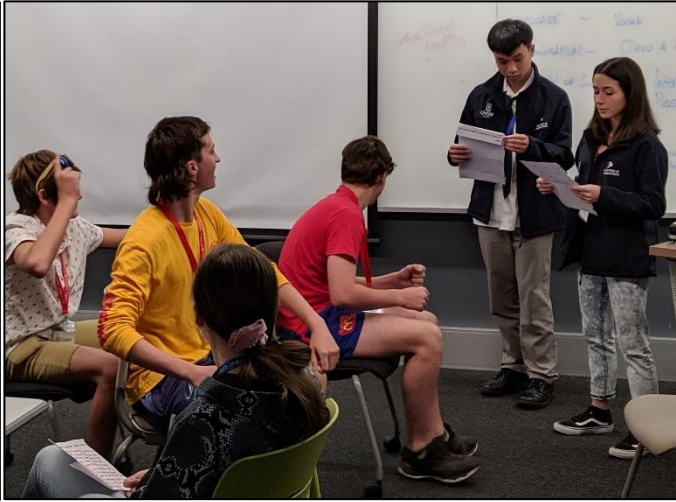
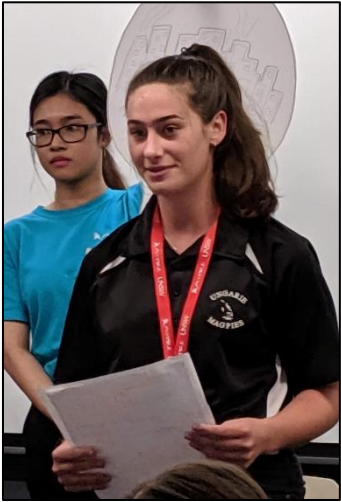
Will visited business related to Technology and Law. The first visit was to Atlassian, a tech company who make software for major corporations and then was taken on a tour of the Stock Exchange.

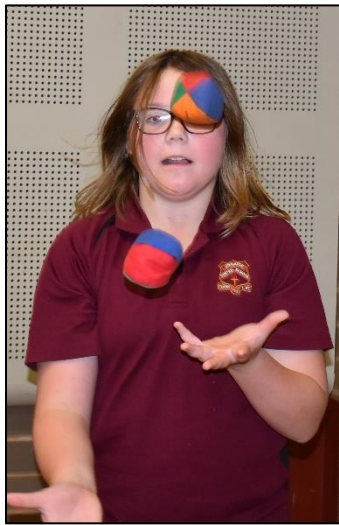

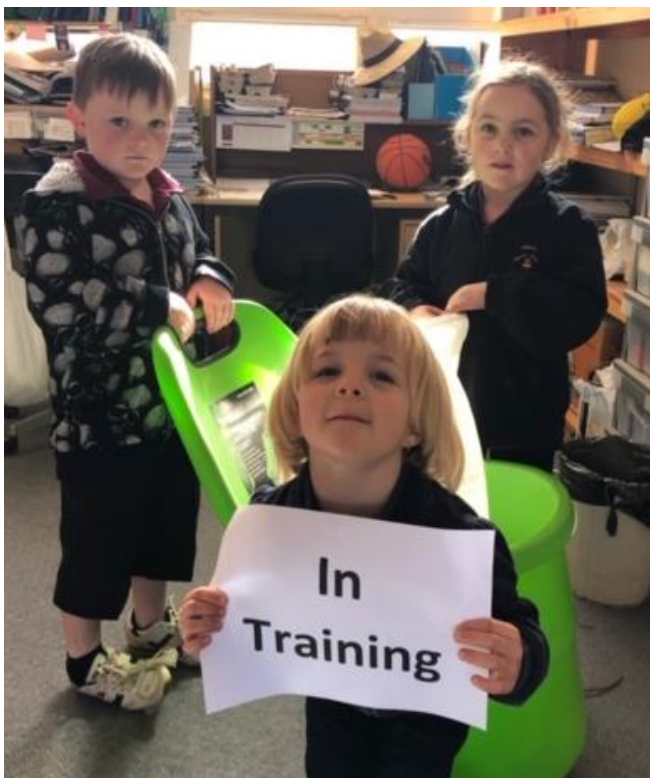
