## From the Principal's desk...

Welcome back to another busy term at Ungarie Central School. We hope everyone had an enjoyable and relaxing break. I know our staff definitely enjoyed a well-earned break after the busy term.

Staff have been involved in a variety of professional learning opportunities this week. SASS staff, Telea Imrie and Ben Cafe attended a Youth Mental Health First Aid course in West Wyalong for two days. They covered areas such as depression, anxiety, self-harm, eating disorders and aggressive behaviours. With the pressures that children have in today's society it is great to have two members of staff trained in this. Mareea James and Michelle Roscarel presented their work with Ozobots and Lego EV3s to staff from the Riverina Access Program in Barellan on Monday. Paul Laing, Principal of Barellan Central School, was impressed with the use of STEM resources at UCS when he visited last term and invited Mareea and Michelle to share their knowledge with the staff. All other staff members focused on both teacher and student wellbeing at school on Monday. A wellbeing day has been planned next Wednesday for students in years 7-10. Other days will be planned for other classes later in the year.

This afternoon we are holding a 2020 Year 11 Subject Selection meeting. All current Year 10 students are invited to attend with their parents to learn about the Lachlan Access Program and the HSC. Students are welcome to attend by themselves if a parent is unavailable. Afternoon tea will be provided after the meeting. If you cannot attend the session, Mr Atkins will be in contact to make a time that suits next week to meet and discuss your child's subjects for next year.

Next week our four recorder girls, Rachel Ridley, Hannah Wilson, Madi Vinecombe and Caitlin Rossiter, will travel to Sydney to perform at the Opera House. They have dedicated time to practising the pieces with Mrs Mason over the past six months and we wish them all the best as they embark on this wonderful experience.

Our numbers were given a boost this week with seven new enrolments! This means we now have 100 students enrolled at UCS, with 58 students in K-6 and 42 in 7-12. We welcome Jordyn, Natasha, Rachel, Daniel, Samantha, Nathan and Chelsey to UCS and know you will enjoy your time here. In other interesting news, we now have five sets of twins currently enrolled at UCS, that's 10% of our school population!

## Premiers Spelling Bee – Date Change



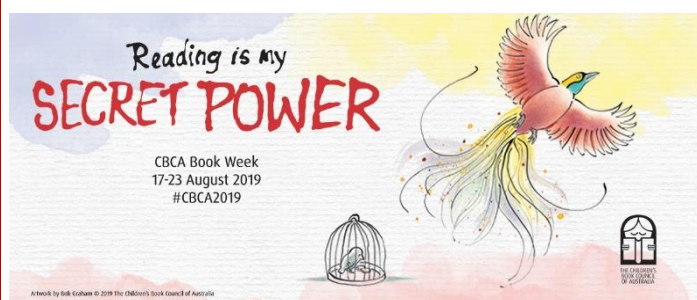
Due to a clash in dates, the school spelling bee to determine regional finalists will now be **Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> of August (Week 3).**

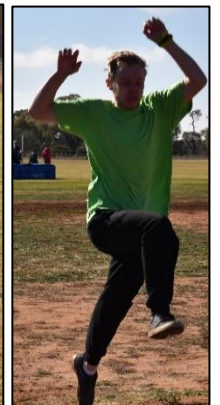
