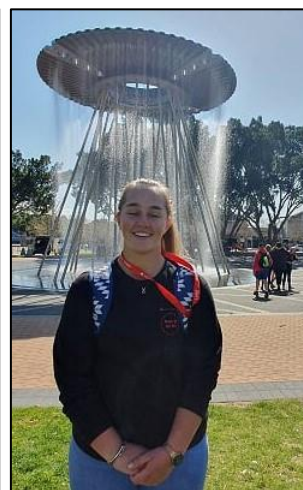
UNSW ASPIRE YEAR 9 'TEAM UP FOR UNI' EXCURSION

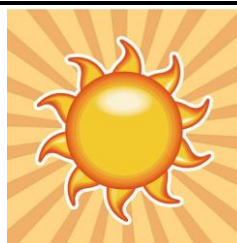

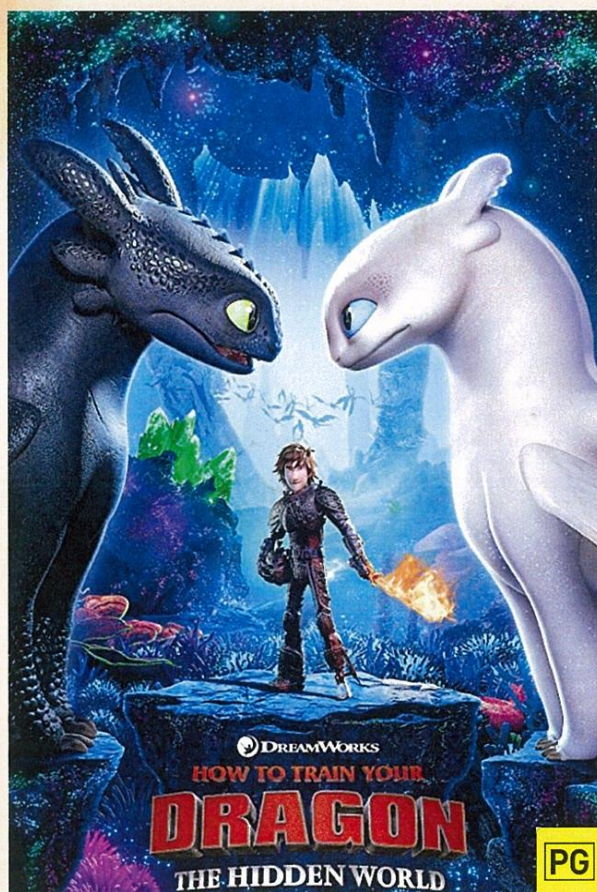

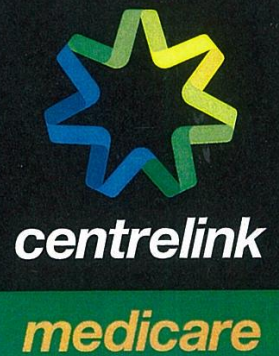
