## From the Principal's desk...

I can't believe that we're already at that time of year where we announce our staffing plans for next year. We will have some changes in the primary classrooms next year, with Mrs Parkinson returning from 12 months leave. The classes will be as follows for 2020:

We will advertise for a replacement for Miss Johnston early next year, as she will be on maternity leave at the end of Term 1. Mrs Atkins will be off class next year and will have a number of roles, including working as a Learning and Support Teacher across the whole school and continuing in her role as Assistant Principal. Mrs Wilson and Mrs Payne will continue to work across K-6 in Maths, English and other Key Learning Areas. In Secondary, Miss Parkinson successfully applied for a Rural Experience position, which means she will remain with us for 2020. Mrs Bussenschutt will join us on staff as Mrs Ridley has decided to move to a casual teaching role. Even though there will be changes, we will continue to provide a quality education for all students at Ungarie Central School in 2020.

Although the end of the year is near, staff continue to work on their professional development. Mrs Cooper and Mrs Jackson attended a 'Google Boot Camp' at Condobolin HS for two days this week. After a three-hour exam on the second day, they have become Level 1 Google Certified Educators. 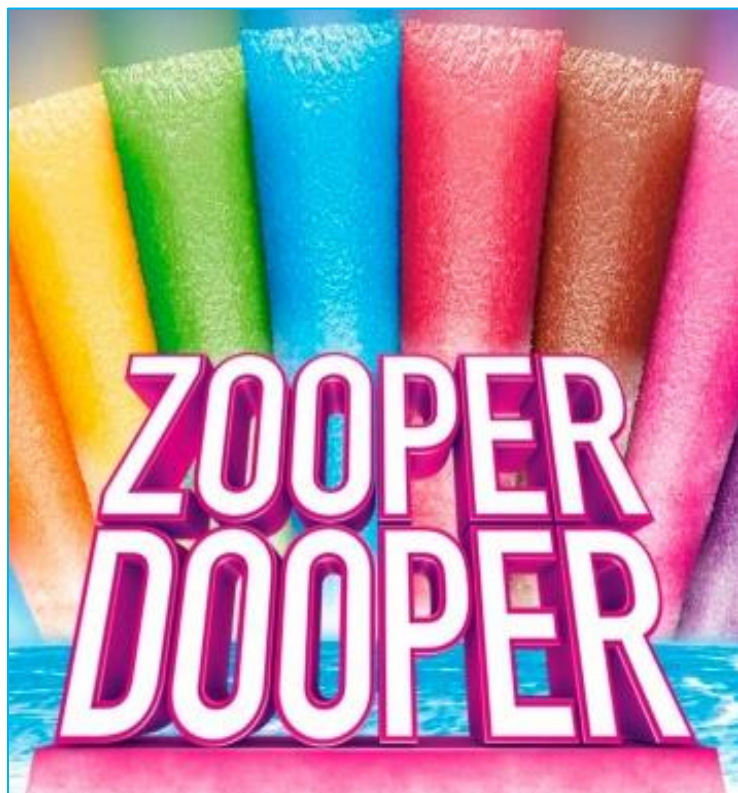

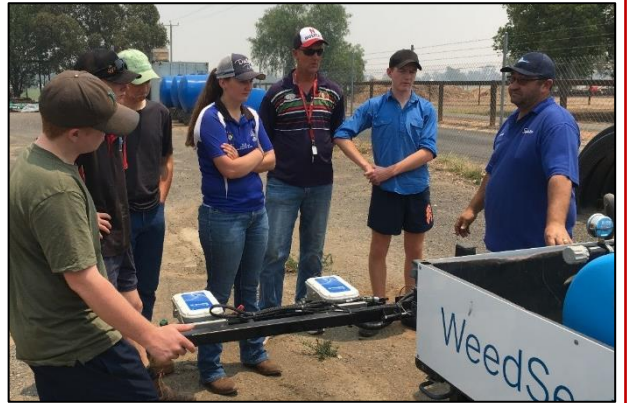


## SCHOOL HAPPENINGS

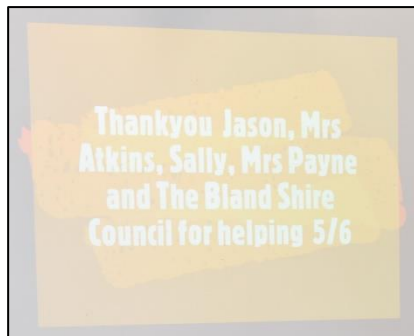
