## STAGE 5 CHILD STUDIES

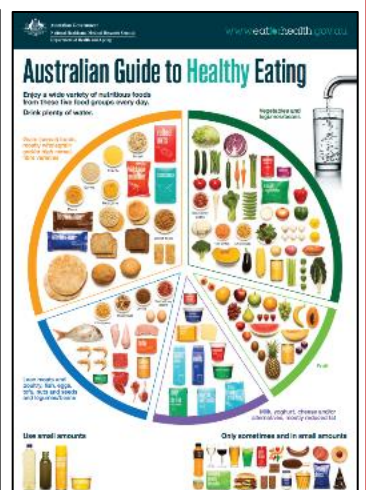

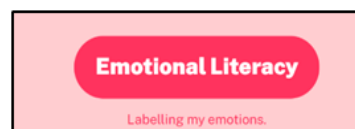
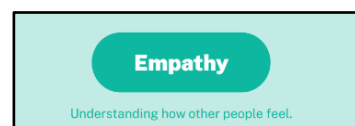

## BEACH WEEK 2021 – Water Safety K - 6

During Week 9, all primary students will be involved in the BIG BEACH WEEK 2021 program. This year the NSW Royal Life Saving have organised this especially for schools in rural and remote areas.

On Wednesday 1st December K – 6 students will have the opportunity to attend a Zoom session with Lifesavers from the coast. They will be passing on their knowledge of beach, coastal and waterways safety to our students. The session will be interactive with lots of questions and opportunities for the students to give their thoughts and experiences.

During the week students will be involved in water safety activities in the classroom and they will practice some lifesaving skills in the pool.

### School Banking update from Commonwealth Bank

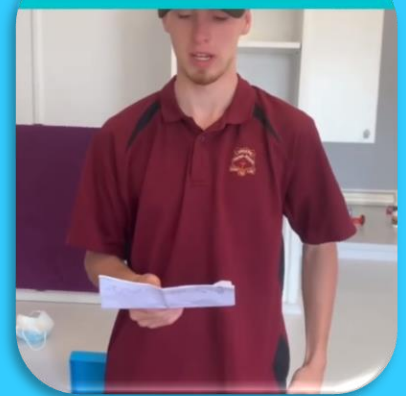
