YEAR 5/6 LEADERSHIP GROUP INTERACTIVE CULTURAL GARDEN - Yungaay Nguluway



This year the students have been busy extending the Cultural Garden to include some Indigenous plants. Their leadership skills have developed through the planning and construction of their fabulous garden. The area they have created will be enjoyed by many children in the years ahead.

The students have also extended the mosaic artwork in the centre of the Interactive Cultural Garden. This will create a yarning circle and a perfect location for outdoor learning. Their mosaic designs represent local native animals and plants and some Indigenous inspired symbols. The students have carefully selected different coloured stones and pushed them into the wet cement to create their artworks.

Year 5/6 students would like to thank Evolution Mining Cowal Partnering Program for providing a generous contribution of \$7,450 towards the Interactive Cultural Garden. Some of the funds have been used to purchase plants, bark chips, irrigation hose and garden edging. The remaining funds will be used to complete the project in 2022.

We would also like to thank Ungarie Preloved for their wonderful donation of \$500 which has been used to purchase the hay and some of the plants for the garden.

A huge thank you to Mr Lindsay Henley for the use of his telehandler to move the garden soil and Malcolm Carnegie (Lake Cowal Foundation) for locating and transporting our plants.

We also appreciate the hours of assistance Jason Lewis and Sally Russell (Lake Cowal Conservation Centre) have given us throughout this project.

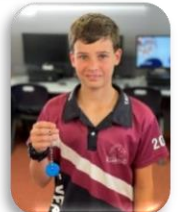

They navigated their Blue Bot to a finish point avoiding obstacles along the way.

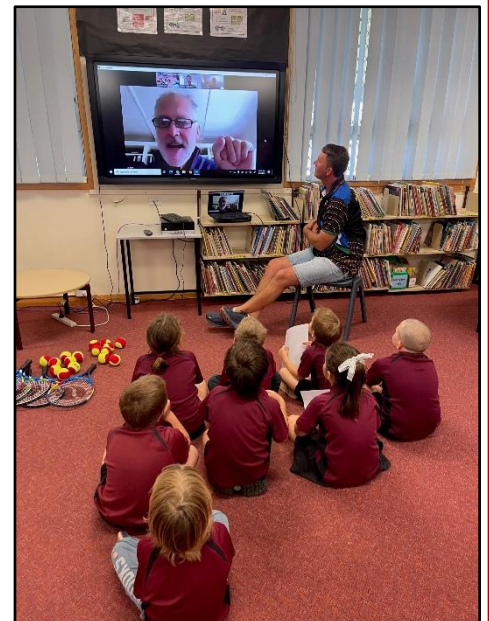


K/1/2 MEET AUSTRALIAN TENNIS LEGEND JOHN FITZGERALD

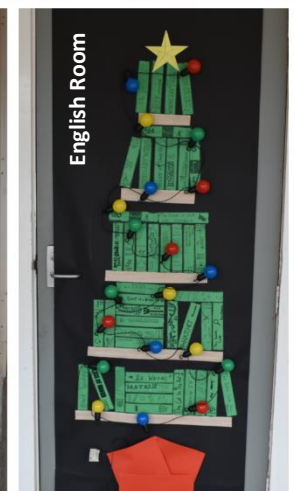
Kindergarten asked John the following questions with some very informative replies.

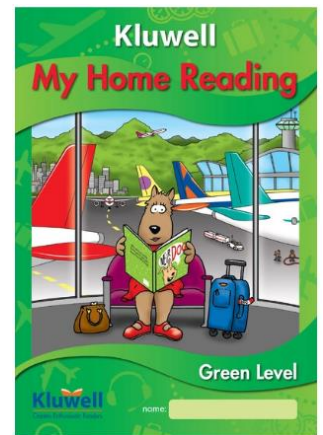

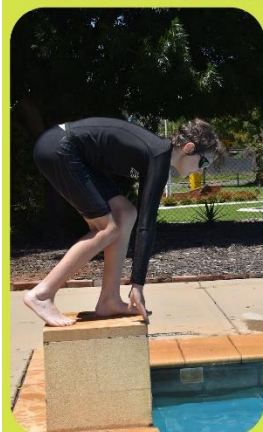


UCS INTENSIVE SWIMMING - TERM 4, WEEKS 7 & 8

Evie Henley was the recipient of a Western School Sport Association Sporting Blue at the Ungarie Central School Presentation Day on Wednesday 8th December, 2021.

The Sporting Blue script read....

Evie Henley was selected in the NSW School Sports Unit Primary All Schools Girls Australian Football Team in May. Evie produced a series of outstanding performances to achieve this success.

In March, she attended the Southern Inland All Schools trial in Wagga Wagga and was selected from more than 100 registered athletes to represent Southern Inland at the NSW School Sport Unit State Selection Trial.

On a bitterly cold and wet day at Blacktown International Sports Park, Evie produced some outstanding football as a midfielder and forward, helping Southern Inland to 2 wins from their 5 games played. Her performances came under notice from the State Selectors, one of just two Southern Inland players to be selected in the NSW Girls All Schools Primary Australian Football Team. Evie was an outstanding representative for her school, region and team at this event displaying maturity and leadership throughout.

She is an outstanding candidate for the honour of a Western Region Blue.



EVIE HENLEY WESTERN REPRESENTATION IN 2021

Evie Henley has been selected to represent Western Region and Southern Inland for five different sports in 2021 being Cricket, Basketball, Cross Country, Netball and AFL (Southern Inland).

Western Cricket trials were the first for the year on 5th March 2021 in Dubbo. Evie was selected in the Western team to compete at the NSWPSSA Primary Girls Cricket Championship scheduled to be held in Barooga from Tuesday 2 November 2021 to Friday 5 November 2021, but the event was cancelled due to COVID-19. The Western Girls Basketball trials were held in West Wyalong on Monday 8th March, 2021. Evie was selected in the Western team and completed at the NSWPSSA Basketball Championships held from the 1st – 3rd June at the Penrith Valley Regional Sport Centre in Cambridge Park. Evie was lucky to attend this event with her twin sister and was honoured to be awarded the PSSA cap for 'Best Team Player' in their final game against Riverina. This award is chosen by the Riverina team's coach.

Cross Country trials were held on Friday 11th June in Geurie where Evie placed 6th in the 12/13 Girls age group. Evie was to represent Western at the NSW PSSA Cross Country Championship on 16th July but unfortunately due to COVID-19 this event was also cancelled.

Evie was selected in the Southern Inland Girls AFL team who trialled on Thursday 2nd April, 2021 in Wagga. The team competed at the NSW Primary All-Schools Girls 12 Years and Under Australian Football Trial held at Blacktown International Sports Park on Friday 7th May 2021. Evie and another Southern Inland teammate from Albury were named in the first-ever NSW PSSA Australian football girls team after a shining display at the state carnival. These trials were an 'All Schools Selection' included approximately 110 girls from across NSW. The Merit team were presented with their NSW uniform and had official photos taken.

The NSW team were to compete in Adelaide at the National Titles but unfortunately due to the ongoing COVID-19 outbreaks, all School Sport Australia Championships for 2021 have been cancelled, so the team didn't play at a national level this year.

The final trials were for Netball and were held at the district trials day in Dubbo on Thursday 6th May 2021. Evie was selected in the Western team and the team was due to play at the NSWPSSA Carnival in Menai from 19th – 21st July but unfortunately due to COVID-19 the event was cancelled.
