Stage 5 Ag Tech students are studying a unit on beekeeping this term, and finally had a nice day to get out in amongst the hives last week. Students learned about the PPE used when checking hives, making sure that all zippers and velcro were securely fastened before going anywhere near the hives - bees are very curious and will find an opening if given the chance! Students were able to have a go at opening hives themselves, pulling out frames to check for the presence of a queen, eggs, capped and uncapped brood, uncapped and capped honey, pollen stores as well as pests present in the hives. Everyone had a go at each task and did very well.

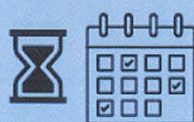
