Years 7-10 enjoyed a circus and gymnastics session yesterday. With another two sessions before the end of term I'm sure they'll be experts soon!

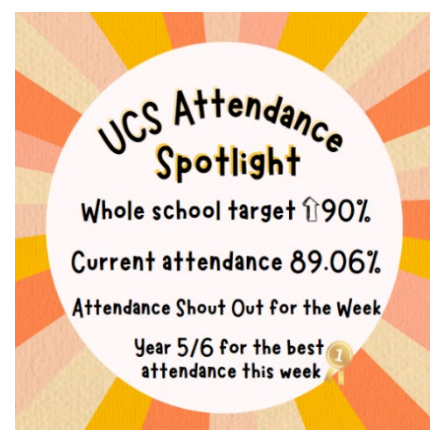
