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From the Principal's desk...

With just over two weeks until the end of year for students, there is still so much coming up!

Tonight, we have our school performance, Dancing with the Stars. There will also be other musical performances scattered through the night. Students have been practising tirelessly and would love to see you there. We had our dress rehearsal today and it's looking fantastic!

With the end of year coming, we are beginning to see some negative behaviours creep into the playground and classroom. We've reminded many students about expected behaviour and will continue to monitor over the remainder of the year.

School supervision begins at 8.30am. Please do not drop your child at school or let them arrive prior to this as there is no teacher supervision.

Students in K-4 have almost finished their first week of Intensive Swimming. Swimming lessons are vital for our students as they ensure students are comfortable and confident to be at the beach, on a boat, around a pool or near a creek. Based on results from a study conducted by Royal Life Saving Australia, approximately 1 in 5 children are unable to swim the length of an Olympic swimming pool by the time they finish primary school. This is why our yearly lessons are so important.

On Monday we held our 2023 School Captain speeches. The nominees all gave impressive speeches, making it very difficult to choose. Votes are currently being tallied and our 2023 captains will be announced at Presentation Night. I have enjoyed working with our 2022 captains, Abby Wason, Nicholas Batty and Olivia Rossiter who have all grown in confidence over the year.

Years 7-10 are enjoying the gymnastics and circus sessions this term. They're learning so many new skills that they usually don't get exposed to due to our location. There were some very impressive gymnasts when I went past yesterday.

Our Semester Two Reward Day will be held on Friday 16th December, the last day of school for students. Parents of those students whose behaviour has made them ineligible to be part of the day will be contacted. Attendance is also linked to the rewards with those students with unexplained absences on their attendance record also ineligible to attend. Letters were sent home this week asking for absences to be explained and must be returned today. All absences for the remainder of the term must also be explained.

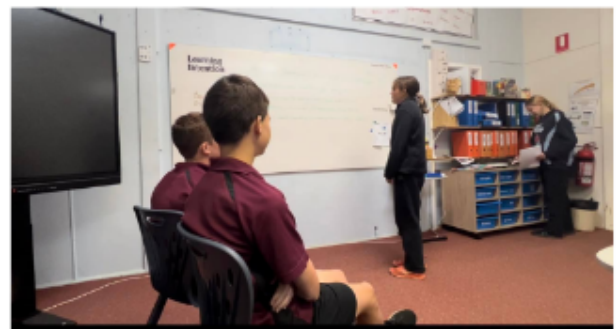

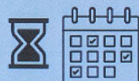

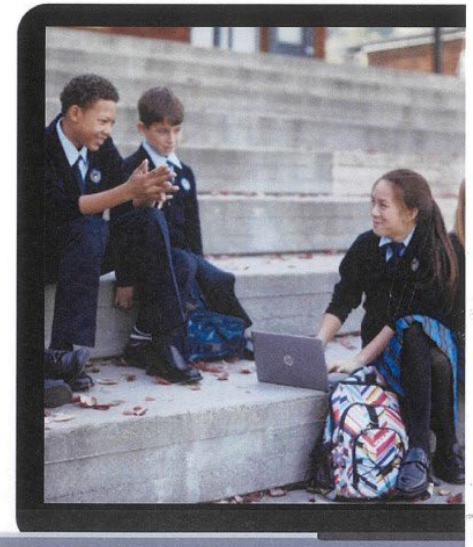
