for all students attending this day also.

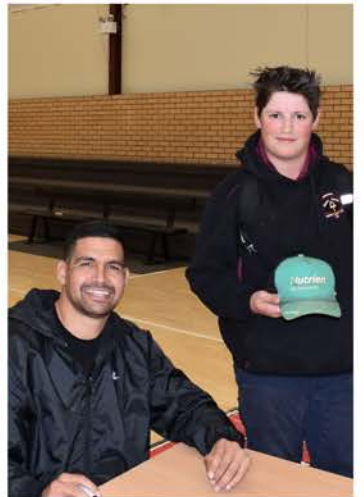
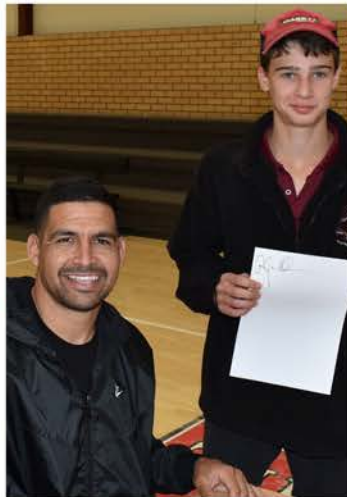

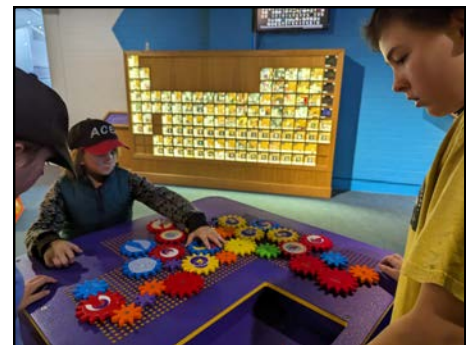




Students also participated in other programs including a sketching and drawing workshop at the National Gallery of Australia and learning about Australia's currency with a tour of the Royal Australian Mint.

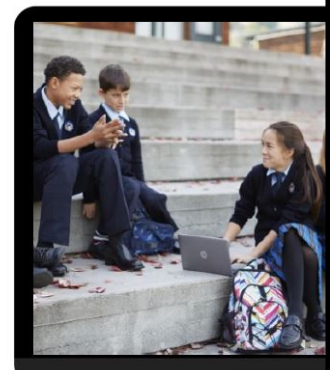
