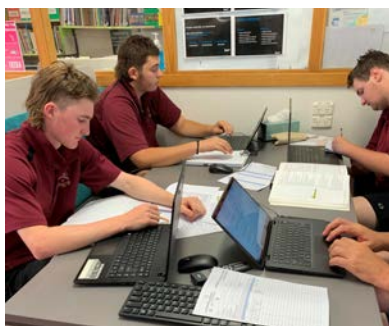

Keeping our Students Healthy - Head Lice



TIP 1

PERFORM ROUTINE HEAD CHECKS ON YOUR CHILD

Ask your child to sit down, and gently pull back his or her hair to inspect the scalp and behind the ears. If you happen to see these little critters during your inspection, seek out professional lice treatment right away.



TIP 2

TELL YOUR CHILD NOT TO SHARE HATS OR HAIRBRUSHES

If your child likes to share his or her hats, helmets, headbands, hair brushes, headphones, coats, or scarves with other kids, it's highly recommended that you advise against this.



TIP 3

STERILIZE YOUR CHILD'S BELONGINGS

A great way to prevent head lice from latching onto your child is to clean and sterilize all objects that your child uses on a regular basis. Take the time to clean your child's sheets, pillow cases, combs, and hair brushes.

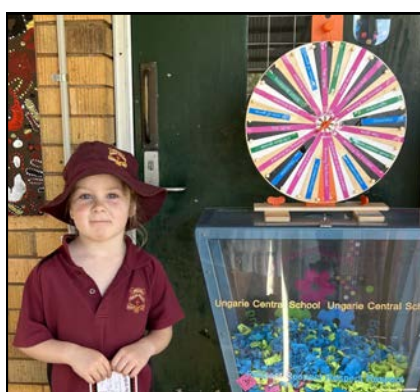


'HUMBUG HIGH FIVE' AND SPORTS AWARD RECIPIENTS FOR WEEK 5

SPORTSMANSHIP

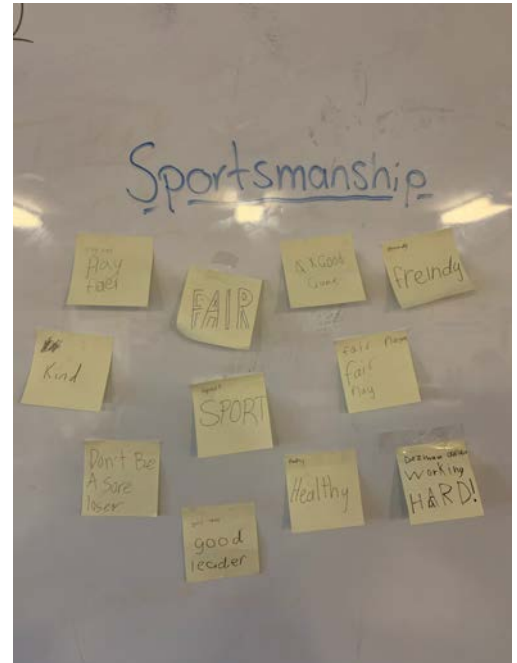
Learning Intentions:

Being calm and present at any given moment.

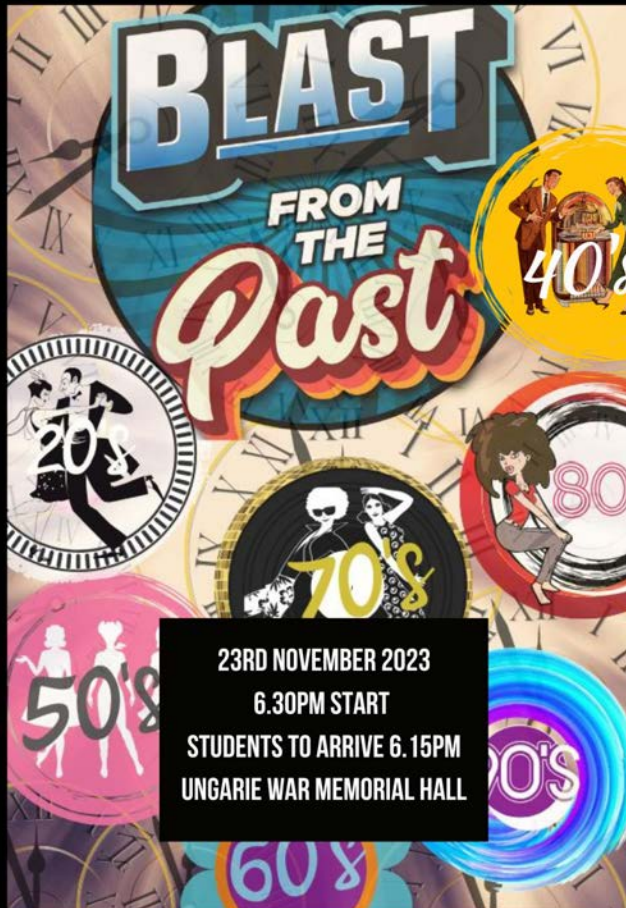

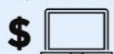

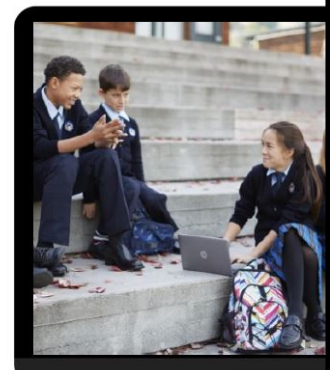
