

She worked with our Indigenous students to come up with a design for the cubby house. They focused on the Humbug creek running through the town and the various community connections we have.

These are represented by the meeting place symbols.

All students added their fingerprint to the creek to represent themselves as either a fish or turtle. All 7/8 students also helped with the painting in the secondary quad.

As with all practical projects, the students completed an indepth Design Folio. This focused on design, manufacturing specifications and experimentation.












Home Reading Awards will be presented at our Friday Assembly on 13 December, 2024 (Term 4, Week 9).
