#### From the Principal's desk ...


Can you believe it's already the end of another term? Time sure flies when you have a busy term filled with learning and extracurricular activities.

# STAGE 5 FOOD TECHNOLOGY

During Food Technology this Term, students have been learning about food selection and health. They have spent time learning about the nutrients and their uses, the digestive system, food consumption patterns and dietary disorders from under and overnutrition. While learning about healthy food choices students participated in a range of practical lessons that allowed them to learn new skills while cooking healthy food alternatives. Some of the foods cooked included; buddha bowls, rainbow rice paper rolls, zucchini Singapore noodles and grasshopper slice. Students are looking forward to using the newly renovated Food Technology room next term.











## YR 5/6 STEM













Year 5/6 STEM have been making tables from eight pieces of newspaper and masking tape. They first made a table with only basic instructions and tested them to see how much they would hold. Not much! After class discussion about what added strength to construction, students went back and designed new tables which were much more successful. After they had built them, students did a plus and minus for each design and voted on which table they thought would be the strongest. All held 1kg, some 2kg and Isla, Claudia and Ruby's table held 6kg. Wow!

# **Stage 4 Technology Mandatory**

During Technology Mandatory in Term 1, students have been working through the design process to design and construct an LED night light. Once the students had undertaken research they designed their bases and acrylic tops. Students learnt about safety in the workshop and the correct way to use a range of timber hand tools to construct their bases.

The computer program Beam Studio was used to design the top acrylic piece before outsourcing it to be cut and engraved on a laser cutter. Students had to carefully follow instructions to solder USB cords to their LED strip, thankfully everyone got their light strips working.

The end results are fantastic!
