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

University of Wollongong Workshop

UCS secondary students engaged in workshops lead by James Barton from the University of Wollongong on Friday 21st March.

Year 7 - 10 students attended the workshop as a group, discussing all aspects of university life. James provided insight into what university life is like, from the less structured learning environment to a city where 10% of the population are students. Next, the students explored how setting their own timetables and schedules requires a balancing act to keep priorities in check. They also discussed pathways to university and learned that at least 50% of all jobs in 2035 haven't yet been realised! The session concluded with advice on how to organise priorities and tips for finding a job that they would enjoy for years to come.

Year 11 and 12 students discussed many of the same topics as Years 7 - 10. Additionally, they explored job opportunities for university students, early admission, and bridging courses. As Wollongong has a large student population, many businesses utilize students to fill job gaps, providing numerous part-time work opportunities while studying. UOW offers early admission, allowing students to receive a university offer before sitting the HSC.

Finally, bridging courses are available to ensure that every student can find a suitable pathway to their desired degree or career.

3/4 STEM Boat Making

On Thursday 13th February, Year 3/4 students were tasked with the objective of building a boat in small groups. The goal was to create a boat that was both strong and buoyant enough to hold as many marbles as possible while staying afloat. To simulate the experience of working within a budget, students were given \$7 to purchase materials, including foil, tape, paddle pop sticks, cling wrap, and straws. They had to manage their finances efficiently to ensure they had enough money left for improvements after their first test.

In this lesson, students began the initial building phase by developing the design for their prototype. There were some very creative ideas, although a few would be difficult to bring to life. Nevertheless, it was great to see their innovation in action. Groups started constructing their boats before the lesson ended.

On Thursday 20th February, the 3/4 class completed their prototypes and began testing. After their initial tests, groups were able to identify areas for improvement, such as adding counterweights, strengthening the base, and building higher side walls. They then used their leftover money to purchase materials to implement these improvements.
