
Mrs Ward and Mrs Wason would like to congratulate the students on their behaviour and engagement during the excursion. It was a good time away.




# YR7/8 SOIL TESTING

In Week 9, Year 7/8 Science students have been exploring the importance of soil as a vital resource. They conducted several soil tests, including a soil jar test to estimate the proportions of sand, silt, clay, and humus in soil samples taken


from the agricultural plot garden area. Students also examined the water-holding capacity of sand, garden soil, and potting mix. Through these experiments, they learned that more organic matter needs to be added to the ag plot garden, and that both sand and potting mix have poor water-holding capacity.














# THE MAN CAVE


