



To wrap up Term 1 and their studies on the Viking Age, students in Year 7/8 were split into 4 groups and took on the challenge of designing and building their own Viking ships. This hands-on project helped consolidate their learning about Viking life, exploration, and shipbuilding.

On Wednesday, 9th April, the students, with Mrs Bussenschutt, made their way to the Humbug Creek to test their boats. The 4 boats underwent 3 tests, with some, sinking quickly. Students competed for two awards: Most Historically Accurate Viking Ship and Best Floating Boat.

The winners for Most Historically Accurate were: Mia Boschko, Charlotte Hoskinson and Taylah Ward, while Caleb Protheroe, Owen Jackson, and Linden Olsen - O'Connor took out the crown for Best Floating Boat.














# K/1/2 are on the hunt!

This marks the first time the Riverina U15's Girls have advanced to the NSWCHS Girls Australian Football Championships Grand Final.

The big dance was against Sydney North. The girls showcased their skills and competed fiercely. Their determination and teamwork paid off, as they earned a fantastic 2nd place overall!

On Monday 12th May, our school was buzzing with energy as students gathered at the Ungarie War Memorial Hall for an exciting performance by Mitch Tambo! Mitch is a proud singer/songwriter, social worker, and advocate for youth and culture. A proud Gamilaraay and Birri Gubba man and Australia's Got Talent finalist, Mitch blends traditional Gamilaraay language with English in reimagined classics and originals and has over 70 songs on Spotify. Mitch's powerful vocals and infectious beats had everyone dancing and clapping from the first note!



The performance was more than just music - Mitch shared his culture, explaining the stories and significance of many of his songs. He also welcomed questions from curious students, creating a meaningful and interactive experience. To top it all off, Shay-Lee led a conga line, which led back to the stage where Mitch joined in the fun!

After recess, Mitch held a Yarning Circle for students in Years 4-10. Students participated in a silent healing practice and ended the session with a cultural song and dance. Mitch spent his lunchtime playing basketball with our secondary students before diving into a workshop with students from Years 5-8. They looked at artifacts and animals and listened to and learnt about the didgeridoo, more traditionally called the Yidaki.

Finally, staff were involved in an enriching workshop where they learnt more about Mitch's backstory and his belief that the adversity and challenges he has faced have enabled him to become the strong, confident and compassionate person he is. Staff also learnt about life before colonisation from an Indigenous perspective.

The workshops provided a lot of insight, understanding and new perspectives for everyone. It was an unforgettable experience that brought joy, movement, and cultural pride to students from all year levels.
