




9/10 are Burnin' Up in Science

On Thursday 8th May, 9/10 students conducted flame tests to observe the colours produced by elements when heat energy is added. In the tests, heat energy (from the flame) excites the electrons in the metal atoms, causing them to jump around, then quickly start falling back to their original positions while still releasing energy. This energy is released in the form of light





and this is when the colour is emitted. The colour produced by the metal depends on the energy difference of the excited electrons and their natural energy state.

There was some colourful and imaginative handiwork, which sure looked delicious!




