This term, Year 5/6 have been building teamwork skills through activities which required all team members to work together to achieve a common goal.

Walking Planks (pictured above) require perfect timing and movement combined with clear communication skills to move forwards as a team. After a few false starts and remembering their left and right, all 3 teams were able to move quickly across the playground. Turning a corner required a new set of movements, but all teams managed this challenge through discussion, trial, error and persistence.

Stacking the Blocks (pictured below) required each team member to hold a piece of rope to manoeuvre a wooden board with a hook to pick up a number of blocks, move them and stack them on top of each other. Again, clear and concise communication teamed with resilience, patience and slow, careful movements were required to hook the blocks to stack them without the blocks falling over.

Both teams were successful in stacking and unstacking all 4 blocks.
